WHY INVEST IN BROWN ADVISORY EQUITY INCOME?

Above-average dividend yield and growth potential can add stability to a core portfolio. approach to security selection. Initial screens Manager seeks to produce a dividend yield higher than the S&P 500® Index, and initiate positions only in stocks that yield at least as much as the Index. We emphasize firms that are likely to raise dividends in the future and companies with growth that have the potential to compound over time. This combination of above-average yield and growth can help to potentially lower a portfolio's overall volatility over a fullmarket

Our process. The strategy uses a bottom-up filter for the following traits: dividend yield, payout ratio and growth, earnings growth, stock valuation, capital structure and return on equity (ROE). Then, the manager performs fundamental analysis and assess management. The portfolio typically holds 35-45 securities and strives for low turnover.

- 4. The benchmark is the S&P 500° Index. The S&P 500 Index is a capitalization-weighted index of 500 stocks that is designed to measure performance of the broad domestic economy through changes in the aggregate market value of 500 stocks representing all major industries. The **Market Capitalization** refers to the aggregate value of a company's publicly traded stock. **Weighted**Average Market Capitalization of a portfolio equals the average of each holding's market cap, weighted by its relative position size in the portfolio (in such a weighting scheme, larger positions have a greater influence on the calculation). **Price-Earnings Ratio (P/E Ratio)** is the ratio of the share of a company's stock compared to its per-share earnings. P/E calculations presented use FY2 earnings estimates; FY1 estimates refer to the next unreported fiscal year, and FY2 estimates refer to the fiscal year following FY1. **Beta** is a measure of the volatility of a security or a portfolio of securities in comparison to a benchmark or the market as a whole. A beta less than 1 means that the security will be less volatile than the market, while a beta greater than 1 indicates that the security's price will be more volatile than the market. For example, if a stock's beta is 1.2, it is theoretically 20% more volatile than the market. **Portfolio Beta** is calculated by comparing the series of monthly returns of the portfolio to the monthly returns of the benchmark, for the period of time specified. **Active Share** measures the percentage of holdings in a manager's portfolio that differ from those in the benchmark index. An active share of 0% means that the portfolio is identical to the benchmark, while an active share of 100% means that the portfolio has no common holdings with the benchmark. **Dividend Yield** is the ratio of a stock's projected annual dividend payment per share for the fiscal
