Portfolio Comments

In April, the Brown Advisory Equity Income Composite rose 0.3% (net of fees) slightly underperforming its benchmark S&P 500[®] Index, which rose 0.4%.

Weak performance in our consumer staples stocks—mainly due to weak earnings caused the majority of our underperformance. Recent earnings results from companies across the sector have been weak. Conversely, our consumer discretionary holdings performed quite well during the month, led by V.F. Corporation and McDonald's. McDonald's reported better-than-expected earnings and revenues during the month sending the stock higher.

After weak performance throughout the first quarter, our energy stocks added to performance in April due to an increase in oil prices.

During April, we eliminated Qualcomm from the portfolio. Whether or not Qualcomm is able to complete its planned acquisition with NXP Semiconductors, we see a weak earnings and dividend growth outlook for the company over the next several years.

Terms and Definitions for Representative Account Calculations

The Average Weight of a position or sector refers to the daily average for the period covered in this report of a stock's value as a percentage of the portfolio. The **Total Return** of an equity security is the sum of the return from price movement and the return due to dividend payments or other sources of income. Standard benchmark-, sector- and portfolio-level returns are the sums of the weights of each security multiplied by its return, summed and calculated daily and summed over the period covered by the report or by an otherwise-noted period. **Contribution to Return** is calculated by multiplying a security's beginning portfolio weight by its daily return and geometrically linking the security's daily contribution to return over the entire reporting period.
